Fact or Opinion Batty Statements Activity

This activity can either be used an activity prior to introducing a bat unit in your class to gauge your students' understanding of bats or as a follow-up activity to see if the students have a good understanding of the lessons taught. Below are several suggestions for using this activity.

Option 1: Read the below statements to your class, or have them read the statements themselves. Then have them decide which statements are facts and which are opinions.

Option 2: Working alone, in pairs or small groups, provide students with the below statements. Have them carefully cut the statements out and then divide them into two piles; one pile for facts and the second pile for opinions.

Option 3: Designate "fact" and "opinion" areas in the room. Hand each child a statement, have him/her read it out loud and then move to the appropriate area.

Option 4: Give each student the page of statements. Have students cut the statements apart along the lines and then glue them to a piece of paper under the appropriate "fact" or "opinion" heading.
